
CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR STUDENTS!

Several of our upper level students have earned acceptance into renown schools for summer study. We recommend that dancers in Levels V and VI audition for prestigious summer programs, and our directors help guide each student for which programs would be the best options for them. Not all summer programs are equal, nor appropriate for every dancer. Upper level dancers younger than 15 are encouraged to audition for the experience and are encouraged to train here at The Studio in the summer. Our summer programs offer consistency and excellent training, both important to every dancer's growth.

Our dancers have been accepted into the Houston Ballet School, San Francisco Ballet School, LINES Ballet, the Alvin Ailey School in New York City and to the Dance Programs at CS Irvine, Santa Barbara and Chapman University.

17-year-old students Patrick Westerman and Ryan Gonzalez, pictured at right, both earned FULL Scholarships to the San Francisco Ballet Advanced Summer Program. Awards like this are rare and are a testament to talent and training, but more importantly, they acknowlege hard work and dedication. The Ballet Alliance Festival is the ultimate learning opportunity for pre-professional dancers. The dancers take master classes with their peers from across the region. Recruiters from professional companies and schools as well as prestigious college and university dance programs offer professional contracts, scholarships and early acceptance to dancers. The region is made up of twenty pre-professional companies from Arizona, Washington, Idaho, Utah and California. The standards upheld by the region to be a member company are high, and every company aspires to continue its growth. Directors network and have a very supportive camaraderie. Dancers become friends and see each other each year at the Festival, as well as at summer programs. They cheer each other on in performance.

This February our Senior Company will be adjudicated by this year's Festival Artistic Director. This professional will evaluate our training methods, choreography and organizational structure. He will then choose a work for performance at the annual Festival, which will be held in Spokane this May. Our dancers are also presenting two new pieces for consideration on the Emerging Choreography concert.
