COMPANY DANCERS ARE BACK IN THE STUDIO OVER THE HOLIDAYS

Santa Cruz Ballet Theatre Company dancers are back in the studio over their holiday break, preparing for the upcoming spring repertoire and Regional Dance America Adjudication. While most of us are snug in our houses in front of a fire, these young dancers will be busy preparing new repertoire.

Guest choreographer Eva Stone will be the first visiting artist to work with the Senior Company. She will be re-staging her piece "End of a Year," a wonderful, lighthearted modern dance in Ms. Stone's super-charged style. The dancers won't have to worry about eating too much over the holidays — on the contrary, they'll have to make sure they eat enough to get through this rehearsal period.

SCBT alumnus Nahshon Marden will return to create a new work on the dancers. His "Atmos; Smokey Black" was an atmospheric sensation last season, and we look forward to what he will create this year.

Our own Robert Kelley will be choreographing two new works: one on the Senior Company dancers to be first shown to the RDA Adjudicator Jeffrey Gribler early February, the second will be choreographed on the Junior Company dancers for the Santa Cruz Symphony Children's and Family Concerts. SCBT has commissioned a new score by composer Jerome Begin, Juilliard faculty member and former Music Director of The Studio. Jerome plans on making a modern string quartet, which hopefully someday will be performed live here in Santa Cruz.

We take great pride in bringing in top talent for our student dancers, who are being shaped by each creative experience they can get their hands (and feet) on. We wish them an enriching and challenging experience working with this exciting lineup of choreographers!
