REGIONAL DANCE AMERICA

Our Company dancers are off to Spokane, Washington this month to participate in the 54th annual Pacific Region Festival. Dancer Flora Chatwin's "Good For Nothin' Charm" will open the Emerging Choreographers Concert Tuesday evening. Choreographed to the Benny Goodman recording of Louis Prima's iconic jazz standard "Sing Sing Sing," Flora's piece is a fun romp featuring 10 Senior Company dancers.

All 19 Pacific Region companies will perform on 3 evening concerts. Santa Cruz Ballet Theatre Senior Company will open the final concert with Robert Kelley's "Pivot" choreographed to a score by Jerome Begin. "Pivot" was performed at Festival 1999, and featured Melody Mennite and Lucien Postlewaite in the leading roles. The dancers in the original "Pivot" continued on to careers in several varied professional companies: Melody with Houston Ballet, Lucien with Pacific Northwest Ballet and others in the cast with Alabama Ballet, Ballet Austin, Ballet San Jose, Los Angeles

Ballet, Luna Negra, Missouri Contemporary Ballet, Nashville Ballet and Sacramento Ballet. We are excited to see where our current cast ends up!

At the Festival, our dancers will take master classes. participate in seminars and watch their peers in performance. The Senior Company will be accompanied by several parent chaperones, some Junior Company dancers, and our Artistic Directors. While at the Festival, our directors will also take part in important meetings regarding the operations of our region. The Festival is a momentous educational experience for our dancers. It is one of its kind. Not a competition, it encourages mutual support between dancers and their different companies. Awards are given for choreography, scholarships are awarded for summer intensive programs and early entrance and acceptance to university dance programs is bestowed upon dancers who audition for such awards. In previous years, upward of \$60,000 of scholarship money has been distributed by our region. Go Team Pacific!

SUMMER INTENSIVE PROGRAMS

July 23-August 10 (3 weeks) Levels III through VI

> July 23-27 (1 week) Level II program

Due to the strenuous nature of our intensive programs, the following are required:

3 weeks of the Summer Session for Levels III-VI,

2 weeks of the Summer Session for Level II.

Enrollment must be for the complete curriculum to qualify (e.g. all assigned classes; full weeks).

Enroll by June 1. Students in Level III and up who take the entire summer are eligible for a discount on the Intensive Program.
